Welcome To **Humanities**

Now that you have chosen to study at McMaster, you are probably wondering what to do next - in particular, how to choose your courses.

Your first-year course selection is based on the programs (or majors) you are interested in for Level 2. All of our Level 2 programs have first-year course requirements summarized on the next page. We have provided you with a worksheet to help you plan your Level 1 courses.

A full course load includes 30 units, with 15 units per term. Each course is typically worth 3 units (half year) or 6 units (full year). Meet with an academic advisor if you have concerns about taking a full load.

You will need to enroll in 9 units of required courses (HUMAN 1DL3, 1HL3 & 1VV3) towards the Humanities Concurrent Certificate: Skills for Life. The certificate is designed to provide a foundation for students to develop important academic and career-relevant skills such as oral and written communication, critical thinking, and digital literacy. You are also required to take 12 units from "Course List 1." These courses qualify you for a Level 2 program. The remaining 9 units can be additional courses from the course list, electives from the Faculty of Humanities, or from other Faculties at McMaster.

Understanding Course Codes

The level of the course is worth

Prerequisite: a requirement to be fulfilled before registration in a course is permitted. This is usually the successful completion of another course.

Cross-list: a course listed under multiple subject areas or departments.

Co-requisite: a course which must be taken at the same time as your desired course.

Anti-requisite: an anti-requisite course will be listed if your desired course overlaps substantially with another one, and indicates that you cannot take both.
